### How do I join 4-H?

Great question! Through our partnership with Johnson County BOE, we provide monthly “club meetings” to 5th—8th grade students and they receive their membership through this. Youth in 9th—12th grade will need to contact the 4-H Office to join. It’s **FREE** to join 4-H!

### How do I sign up for 4-H activities/events?

Youth can participate in any eligible 4-H activity or event by having a parent/guardian contact the 4-H Office to sign them up!

### What are Club Meetings? (5th-8th grade)

Club meetings offer an opportunity for 4-H'ers to participate in hands-on learning activities in STEM, healthy living, agriculture and civic engagement in a positive environment where they are encouraged to take on leadership roles and grow in confidence, independence, resilience and compassion.
