**We worship God** — with our voices, with our instruments, with our movement, and with our contemplation, we come to this place to recenter God in our lives. Our singing, clapping, laughter, and introspection all seek to glorify God.

**We pray** — whether in unison or in private, in gratitude or in petition, in discernment or in inspiration, we lift our prayers to God, trusting that in God's faithfulness, God hears us, understands us, and through the power of the Holy Spirit, meets us in our prayers.

We gather around God's Word and the Sacraments — we assert the authority of Scripture, its inspiration, and its invaluable role in expressing God's love for the world by articulating God's redemptive work through Jesus Christ. We centralize the Communion Table and Baptismal Font to recall the means in which we may experience God's grace and to carry forward the traditions of the ancient Church.

We *proclaim* the Gospel of Jesus Christ — whether in music, readings, prayers or preaching, we lift up the Good News of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

We value children — Jesus said, "Let the children come to me, and do not stop them, for it is to such as these that the kingdom of heaven belongs." We desire to provide for children in a variety of ways, both in and outside of the worship spaces. Families are encouraged to discern what's right for you in whatever season you are journeying through.

Following the Children's Message, children entering PreK3-1st grade are invited to Covenant Hall 101 for Godly Play (a supervised sharing of the bible story and snack).

The Prayground is open to all young children who desire to remain in worship—worshipping with us, offering to God the art they create, the friendships they make, and the energy they share with all of us.

Children 2<sup>nd</sup> grade and older are invited to remain in the worship spaces.

We are the Church inside and outside of these walls — as disciples of Jesus, we desire to fortify our faith and to be in encouraged by our worship together. Once nurtured and restored in worship, we are called to live out our faith in the world. So we are sent out to be Christ's ambassadors of his peace, love, and compassion, serving all those we encounter.
