





SUSAN MEYER







Christopher's Contributions in Life:

Chris had been chosen NYC*EMS Station 34's "Rookie of the Year." He was 22 years old and had been on the job less than one year when he became the first emergency medical technician to die in the line of duty in the New York City system's 25-year history. The accident that took Chris's life occurred on June 17, 1994, as he was treating victims of a traffic accident. When a drunk driver crashed into a car and pushed it into Chris, trapping him between two vehicles, he died four hours later at Kings County Hospital after two cardiac arrests.

Stuart "Stu" Smith was a Flight Paramedic, US Marine, mentor, and friend who spent more than 35 years serving the communities of Northern California. He served his country honorably as an Antitank Assaultman in the US Marine Corps from 1976-1980, where he received the Good Conduct Medal and the Rifle Sharpshooter Badge. As a lifelong horseman, Stu was also one of the last Marines to serve on mounted patrol. During his EMS career, Stu cared for more than 2,000 patients, including several field deliveries. Stu died suddenly of a heart attack after coming off flight shift on May 30, 2018.

Randy was involved in emergency services for more than 35 years in the Elizabethtown community.
