**To Access the Academic Planner**

1. "Student Web Portal" takes students to the Student Portal via the web using Safari. Must be used to choose classes.
2. Click on the **AA** at the top and then click on "Request Mobile Website".
3. Log in using your OPS username (sxxxxx####) do not include @ops.org and password (#####).
4. Once Logged in, click on the three lines at the top left, then on Academic Plan.
5. Make sure that your Academic Plan says "**HS Graduation (Grad Class 2019+)**". Click **PROCEED**.
6. Enter or ensure that your **ENGLISH, SOCIAL STUDIES, MATHEMATICS, and SCIENCE COURSES** are entered and correct. You need two semesters of the **SAME** class in each core category.
7. Add in Electives, **CLICK SAVE**

**Tips and Tricks**

1. Use the search bar to look for a class. It will also give you the course information. Or use the course number.
2. Use the column of your upcoming grade level. Ensure that you have two semesters entered for each class.  
Example: H DL US History 1, H DL US History 2
3. You will need to plan 16.000/12.000 credits (located at the top of the column). Each semester course = 1 credit.
4. If you can't find a course in the drop-down menu it might already be entered on a future year. Delete it from that year.
5. You **MUST CLICK SAVE** or your work will be lost.
6. A message will show up that you don't have enough credits planned. Just Click OK.
