



Know Your Options

The Army has two reporting options for domestic abuse. The uncertainties surrounding seeking assistance in these times may be less challenging if you know your reporting options. Knowing your reporting options may help you decide what to do next.

Reporting

- Report ONLY to:
- Military health care provider
 - Family Advocacy Program Manager
 - Victim Advocate

- Incidents may be reported to:
- Command
 - Law enforcement
 - Family Advocacy Program

For emergencies, call 911.

Notifications

When a restricted report is chosen there are no notifications to command or law enforcement.

Command and law enforcement will inform appropriate service providers.

Safety

The Advocate will work with the client to discuss safety and develop a plan.

Command issues a Military Protective Order (MPO). The MPO stops the violence and provides time for the victim to obtain a Civilian Order (if they chose) and create a safety plan.

Privacy

Privacy is maintained with the advocate and health care provider.

Notifications are made to law enforcement and command so necessary actions can be taken.
