Coral Reef Park Capital Project Improvements:

- 1. Pine Rockland Restoration In Progress
- 2. East Side Rubberized Trail Renovation and New Walking Paths Completed
- 3. Coral Reef Recreation Center Project In Progress

A Starting Tuesday, November 12, 2024, and until further notice, sections of the Playground at Coral Reef Park will be closed due to the construction of the new Recreation Center. Entrance to the playground will be detoured through the 152-street sidewalk. In addition, this will include modifications to the main parking lot circulation. Please use caution when visiting the park.

Pine Rockland Restoration

Project Updates 5-14-25

Year Two will focus on invasive management and general pine rockland maintenance; invasive sewer vine in the northwest section; installation of native grasses (Andropogon, Aristida, Eragrostis, Tripsacum) to help stabilize and enhance biodiversity; additional seeds along the northern border where hardwoods were reduced.

In discussion with Miami-Dade Natural Areas Management regarding initiation of required steps for prescribed burning of the pineland.



Project Updates 9-3-24

Task 1: Designated Oak tree reduction/removal from Pine Rockland: January 8, 2024 through March 29, 2024 - **Completed**

Task 2:

1st Quarter invasive species control – Completed February 8, 13, 14, 15 2nd Quarter invasive species control – Completed April/May 2024 3rd Quarter invasive species control – Completed June/July 2024 4th Quarter invasive species control – Completed August/September 2024

At least 97% if treated plants must be dead at least six months following treatment. If 100% of the areas is not treated or 97% kill rate is not achieved for any area after one to six months post final treatment, one additional thorough treatment will be scheduled.

Pine Rockland Restoration

Task 3: Pine Rockland Year 1, Bi-annual treatment. Initial Palm cover estimated to be 80%.

1st treatment: reduce Palm cover by 30% - **Completed January 12 and 15, 2024**

2nd treatment: reduce Palm cover another 30% - Completed May-September 2024

The IRC team recently carried out follow-up work on their scheduled palm reduction (Task 3 in the RFP) as part of our efforts to restore the pine Rockland ecosystem. This involved reducing the density of palms to about 20-30% cover, which will result in downed palm fronds and changes in the landscape. We know this may seem alarming, but it is an essential part of the restoration process. By reducing palm cover, we allow more sunlight to reach the native plants in the understory, which is vital for the health and diversity of the pine Rockland community.

If there are downed fronds along the walkways that are causing any inconvenience, staff will certainly remove them. Otherwise, they should naturally decompose over the next few weeks.


We truly appreciate the communities' support in protecting and restoring this unique ecosystem, which is home to a rich variety of native species.
















East Side New Walking Paths



Installation of Flag Poles and New Fence

Flagpoles, each topped with LED solar lights, were installed to ensure the U.S. Flag is properly illuminated at night. These flagpoles were added in support of the Howard Palmetto Baseball Association, allowing the National Anthem to be played before the start of every game. A new composite split rail fence was installed along the north perimeter of the park on 148th Street, extending from SW 80th Avenue to SW 78th Avenue, covering approximately 1,360 linear feet.
