

#### **PLAYWRIGHT'S NOTE**

I began writing this play in the Fall of 2017 after stumbling across a documentary trailer on Facebook. It was for the film The Silent Truth, which detailed the rape and murder of Private First Class LaVena Johnson. She was stationed in Irag on an American Military Base during the war in 2005. She never made it home. She was nineteen years old. I was more than shocked and surprised when I first heard the story—not because the brutality wielded against her body was egregious in scope and depravity, and certainly not because such violence against bodies like hers (Black and female) are new or out of the ordinary; but because of the overwhelming national silence about what happened to her. Around the time of LaVena's murder, the media was relaying stories about Johnny Walker Linde, the American Jihadist, and Pat Tillman and Jessica Lynch...but nothing about LaVena, an active-duty soldier who lost her life under dubious and curious circumstances, while on an American Military Base. As the granddaughter of two proud World War II veterans and the niece of a Vietnam Veteran and the friend of many active duty and retired military, law enforcement, and government professionals, this was unacceptable to me. So, I sought a way to use my limited talents to try and correct this miscarriage of justice. I want to highlight this tragedy and give dignity and agency to a young woman who was so heinously betrayed by her fellow soldiers in arms, as well as by the Army she served in, and the country she fought for. Her story has been dramatized in this play to allow for creative license in crafting a work of theatrical fiction, however, the essence of her story remains intact. This was the only way I could give justice, peace, and solace to a young woman on the cusp of a destiny that will forever remain unlived and unfulfilled. So tonight, as the wonderful cast and crew put their talent and polish on this production, I hope that you will remember the woman behind the play. Her name is LaVena Johnson and this is for her.

#### **DIRECTOR'S NOTE**

There is nothing quite like digging into a new play. The gifted playwright has the uncanny ability to engage and entertain us all while holding a mirror to us and asking us to reflect on who we are and how we can grow and change the society within which we live. Combine the writer's skills with the talent of designers and technicians, the world of a play can thrust you into some new experience that commands your time and attention. Still, with all these gifted artists working to divert you, the job of bringing the play and its characters to life; of finding the hidden truth that connects the audience to one another in our humanity, belongs to the actor. In this production, I have been blessed with a company of hungry and gifted young artists; each wholeheartedly committed to bringing this story to the stage and, through the power of technology, into your homes. I am so grateful to have shared this experience with all these extraordinary artists and technicians who braved the unknown to bring this story to your attention.

With Black Girl, Interrupted, our gifted playwright, LyaNisha R. Gonzalez has trained her keen eyes and ears (and, hopefully, yours) on the heinous violence that has far too often claimed the lives of brave American soldiers. In 2018, a Pentagon survey showed that the number of sexual assaults in the military had risen to 20,500. These soldiers are our sisters and brothers, our mothers and fathers, our wives, husbands, and our friends, and they committed their lives in service of our country and its freedoms. Far too many of our soldiers have reported enduring such acts of violence and cowardice and yet far too many of their stories remain virtually unknown to us.

Black Girl, Interrupted doesn't merely ask us to face this difficult truth but to posit why such a systemic failure could be allowed to continue without eliciting our collective outrage and move us to action. We enjoy the blanket of freedom provided for us by soldiers of every race, creed, religion, orientation, identity, and gender. Surely, it is our duty to serve and see them all.
