


Story questions for

Fox and Bear

For sharing any book, asking questions helps us experience the story and learn together! Try asking these questions as you look at each page of this book.



- Who lives in the forest?
 What do you see on this page?
- What do you think Bear is thinking? What do you like to eat?
- What do you think Fox is looking for? How many different birds do you see?
- What does Fox bury? There are big and small roots in the picture. Where do they come from?
- Can you match the prints to each animal? What prints do you make where you go?
- What do you like to do when you have time? What are Bear and Squirrel looking for?
- Why does Fox keep the geese in cages? Does he need so many? What is Bear giving to Mouse?

Who is watching the fireflies? What do you think Fox's idea is?

What is Fox planning?
Why are they digging and cutting?

- Can you follow where the egg collector goes? How many trees do you think it took to build the track?
- What do Fox and Bear do all day? What happened to the raven's nest?
- Is Bear still enjoying life? What are Fox and Bear going to do with all the wood and eggs?
- What are your favourite things to do outside? Do you pick berries or hunt?
- Bear is going back into the forest. What do you think Fox will do? What has changed from the beginning of the book?

- Can you find pages where Mouse is? Is Mouse on every page? What about Squirrel?
- What are the pictures in the book made of?
- What are some things you need and some things you want?
