Program Description

The Post Graduate Year One (PGY-1) residency at Mount Carmel East is an advanced training program structured to develop and hone a resident's communication and clinical skills to become a confident, competent pharmacist who can provide effective pharmaceutical care to patients in the acute care setting, as well as to set the foundation to pursue a PGY-2 residency and/or faculty position. We hope the mission of our organization will be a guiding principle to our residents as they utilize the skills they have acquired.

As a PGY-1 at Mount Carmel East, the resident will be based out of Mount Carmel East as a primary hospital and will be exposed to opportunities at multiple sites. This will give the resident exposure to different practice sites, patient populations, and exceptional preceptors within the year.

PGY-1 pharmacy residency programs build on Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) education and outcomes to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists responsible for medication-related care of patients with a wide range of conditions, eligible for board certification, and eligible for postgraduate year two (PGY-2) Pharmacy residency training.

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Residency Program Structure

The Mount Carmel East PGY-1 Residency Program will be a 52-week, rotation-based experience. There are nine one-month core rotation experiences. Residents will choose three months of elective rotation experiences. Residents will also have required longitudinal rotation experiences that will last between 3 and 12 months. Residents may elect (if able) to participate in elective longitudinal rotation experiences that will last between 6 and 12 months.
