PGY-1 pharmacy residency programs build on Doctor of Pharmacy (PharmD) education and outcomes to contribute to the development of clinical pharmacists responsible for medication-related care of patients with a wide range of conditions, eligible for board certification, and eligible for postgraduate year two (PGY-2) Pharmacy residency training.

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

With our mission statement in mind, we believe pharmacists are essential members of a multidisciplinary team, working together with other health caregivers to provide the best care to our patients. The resident will be exposed to a wide range of patient populations and given an opportunity to work concurrently as a clinician and educator. The Post Graduate Year one (PGY-1) Pharmacy residency at Mount Carmel St. Ann's (MCSA) is an advanced training program at a community, teaching hospital structured to develop and hone a resident's communication and clinical skills to become a confident, competent pharmacist who can provide effective pharmaceutical care to patients in the acute care setting, as well as to set the foundation to pursue a PGY-2 residency and/or faculty position.
