

Tips of the Trade - Ink

** Stir up your ink in the jar with a stir stick

** The ink shouldn't be thick but, in the event, that it does thicken up, just add a little bit of distilled water

** Remember our transfers and ink can be used multiple times so feel free to put it on any other surface that can be heat set

** ALLOW INK TO DRY COMPLETELY BEFORE HEAT SETTING (You may speed up the dry time by using a blow dryer or quick dry tool

Heat Setting Ink

** Heat setting with a heat press – place parchment paper on the design, set the temp to 305 degrees and press for 30 seconds. Please be sure to adjust the temperature when working with other materials like polyester or nylon – for Koozie, heat set at 305 degrees for 20 seconds

** Heat setting with an iron – set to medium to high heat and iron in a consistent motion for 3 minutes – for Koozie, iron in a consistent motion for 1 minute ** Heat setting in the oven – place "oven safe" item in the oven. Turn the oven on to 350 degrees and set the timer for 45 minutes. Please allow the oven to cool completely before removing the item.
