## BIOGRAPHIES



**Dr. Christopher Unger** currently serves as Director of Bands at Augustana University where he conducts the Augustana Band Augustana Orchestra, Chamber Winds, and teaches conducting. Under his baton The Augustana Band has been featured at The South Dakota Music Educators Association Convention, The South Dakota Bandmasters Association State Conference, and has performed on stages across the region. In 2019, The Augustana Band embarked on a 21 day performance tour of China, where they were honored with performances in Shanghai, Wuhan, Xi'an, and Beijing.

Previously, Dr. Unger served as the Interim Director of Bands at the University of British Columbia where he conducted the Symphonic Wind Ensemble, Concert Winds, and taught instrumental conducting. Prior to his appointment at U.B.C., Dr. Unger served as the Assistant Conductor of both the Eastman Wind Orchestra and the Eastman Wind Ensemble. At Eastman, Dr. Unger was honored with the Frederick Fennell Fellowship for Advanced Conducting Study, the Evan Whallon Conducting Award, and the prestigious Walter Hagen Conducting Prize. His role at Eastman provided him with the opportunity to act as a producer on the Eastman Wind Ensemble's 2013 release on Avie Records titled Stravinsky-Octet/L'Histoire du Soldat. In addition to conducting the wind

ensembles, Dr. Unger worked with the Brass Guild, the Trumpet Ensemble, and the Graduate Chamber Orchestra. He also was chosen to conduct a featured performance of Imis, by Massimo Luaricella, the 2011/2012 OSSIA International Composition Competition winner, with the Ossia New Music Ensemble.

Dr. Unger's principal conducting teachers were Dr. Mark Scatterday and Dr. Colleen Richardson. He has attended a number of influential conducting symposiums where he worked with master wind conductors such as Donald Hunsberger, Frank Battisti, Charles Peltz, Michael Haithcock, Allan McMurray, Craig Kirchhoff, Michael Votta, Gary Hill, and Rodney Winther. He maintains professional affiliations with the College Band Directors National Association, the World Association of Symphonic Bands and Ensembles, and the Conductor's Guild.

Dr. Unger received his D.M.A in conducting from the Eastman School of Music in 2013. Additionally, he holds degrees from the University of Western Ontario and the University of British Columbia.



**Dan Sailer** is from Sioux Falls, South Dakota where he is an Instructor of Percussion at Augustana University and Assistant Director of the Viking Marching Band. Dan works at Groove Inc. as the Ensemble Director of Groove Pursuit (PIA). He is the Principal Percussionist of the Northwest Iowa Symphony Orchestra and has also performed with the South Dakota Symphony Orchestra and the Sioux City Symphony Orchestra.

Dan is currently the Assistant Percussion Caption Head at the Phantom Regiment Drum and Bugle Corps (Rockford, Il.) He has received numerous snare drum accolades at DCI and PAS solo competitions. Dan has been a percussion staff member for several premier high school groups in the Midwest including Lincoln HS, Irondale HS, and Brandon Valley HS. He has also taught at River City Rhythm, Minnesota Brass, Boston Crusaders, and Troopers Drum and Bugle Corps. Dan provides lessons via the Stryvemind online percussion platform and is frequently booked to compose, teach, adjudicate, and mentor percussionists in the upper midwest.

In 2014, Dan completed a Bachelor's of Music Education in Instrumental and Vocal Music from Concordia University, St. Paul. Dan then graduated with his Master's Degree in Percussion Performance from the University of North Texas in 2019. In his role as adjunct professor at Dordt University (2019-2021), he assisted in producing the album Music With Friends which received 2nd place in the American Prize for College Wind Bands in 2021. Performance credits include the 2019 TMEA Showcase Concert featuring Canadian Brass; the North Texas Wind Symphony recordings featuring Ryan Anthony; the Augustana University Band 125th Anniversary Album recordings with the world premier of "A Prairie of Voices" by James David; and master classes with Frédéric Macarez, Andy Narell, and Wei-Chen Lin.



**Dr. Andrew Hayward** is Assistant Director of Bands and the Director of the Viking Marching Band. Prior to joining Augustana University, he was Director of Bands in West Palm Beach, Florida, where he debuted a marching band, competitive indoor group, and a music curriculum.

Dr. Hayward has been active in the marching arts as a performer, educator, designer, and adjudicator for over twenty-seven years and has won awards at local, state, and regional competitions. He has worked with marching groups in DCI, DCA, WGI, BOA, and USBands. As a visual designer, Dr. Hayward has twenty years of experience and has written for groups across the United States, the Philippines, and China. His passion for design led him to form his own marching arts design company, where he serves as C.E.O. and head designer.

Originally from New Jersey, Dr. Hayward received his D.M.A. in clarinet performance from the Mason Gross School of the Arts at Rutgers University under the guidance of Jessica Phillips of the Metropolitan Opera and Dr. Maureen Hurd. Dr. Hayward's conducting style was primarily guided by Dr. William Berz and Dr. Emily Threinen. He has also had the opportunity to attend conducting symposiums and work with a number of tremendous wind conductors including H. Robert Reynolds, Dr. Glenn D Price, Michael Haithcock, and Dr. Travis Cross.

Dr. Hayward is a proud member of the College Band Directors National Association, Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, South Dakota Bandmasters Association, and the National Association for Music Education.
