## TO ACCESS THE ACADEMIC PLANNER

1. Use the Student Infinite Campus Portal. Log in using your OPS username (sxxxxxx###) do not include @ops.org and password (#####).
2. Once Logged in, click on the three lines at the top left, then on Academic Plan.
3. Ensure you have an Academic Plan selected "HS Graduation (Grad Class \_\_\_\_\_)" Click **PROCEED/NEXT**.
4. Using the column of your upcoming grade level, enter your **ENGLISH, SOCIAL STUDIES, MATHEMATICS, and SCIENCE COURSES**.  
Place two semesters of the **SAME** class in each core category. Example: H DL US History 1, H DL US History 2  
Use the search bar to look for a class. It will also give you the course information. Or use the course number.  
If you can't find a course in the drop-down menu it might already be entered on a future year. Delete it from that year.  
Plan up to 16,000/12,000 credits (located at the top of the column). Each semester course = 1 credit.
5. Add in Electives, **CLICK SAVE** or your work will be lost. A message will show up that you don't have enough credits planned. Just **Click OK**.
