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Touchstone Behavioral Health Services serves youth age birth to 18 years old and their families, with a wide range of services to include medication management, individual and family therapy, and care coordination. Services through Touchstone include evidence-based programs that can include, but are not limited to substance use, trauma, and acting out behaviors. Services can be provided in-home, in the office, or via telehealth. This resource is available during normal business hours, although messages may be left at any time. Touchstone's response is not typically immediate (at the time of call) due to the nature of coordinating care, but inquiries will be answered in a timely manner.

COPE also currently has some grants that can allow families to get the full range of services for substance abuse if they are over or under insured.

COPE is a behavioral health youth and family center that offers services such as individual therapy, family therapy, psychiatric services, group therapy, family support, peer support and case management. They also have an entire substance abuse program for youth that includes two different IOP tracks, MAT services with a provider, a dedicated Recovery Coach, and peer support, as well as case managers trained in the A-CRA modality (a more one-on-one service).

## TUCSON POLICE DEPARTMENT SELF-REFERRAL PROGRAM:

Any person who enters a Tucson Police Department substation and requests help with their addiction to opiates or a poly-drug combination will be immediately addressed for self-referral to a treatment facility. If such a person who has requested help with their addiction is in possession of drugs or drug paraphernalia (foil, needles, pipes, etc.), they shall not be charged for those items.
