

Swift Transportation Independent Contractor Safety Reminder

We want to remind you that as an Owner Operator for Swift, or as an Employee of an Owner Operator for Swift, you are obligated to comply with the terms agreed to in the Owner Operator Contractor Agreement, as well as all applicable federal, state, and municipal laws and regulations. These obligations include, but are not limited to the following:

- If you are involved in an accident, incident or injury, immediately report the event, as outlined in the Owner
 Operator Guide, regardless of fault or severity.
- 2. Immediately report to your Owner Operator Consultant all DOT inspections if any violation is noted/cited and provide a copy of the report as soon as practicable to corporate Safety in Phoenix.
- 3. Your personal safety is important to us so, as required by law, always wear your safety belt while driving.
- 4. Safety technologies like collision avoidance, event recorders, lane departure, electronic logs, and others on your truck are there for your safety as well as those with whom you share the road. You should never disable or tamper with any of these devices or other safety equipment.
- 5. Federal regulations prohibit the transportation of an unauthorized passenger at any time. You may only transport authorized passengers in accordance with federal regulations and Swift's rider program.
- 6. Pre and post trip equipment inspections are required under DOT regulations. You may only operate equipment that you have inspected and is safe to operate. Driving on steer tires with exposed cords, for example, is a violation of DOT regulations.
- 7. You are required under the terms of the Owner Operator Contractor Agreement to always operate you truck in a safe manner. Reckless or dangerous driving is a violation of the law and a breach of the Owner Operator Contractor Agreement.
- 8. Use of a handheld cellphone or texting while driving is prohibited by DOT regulations.
- 9. Federal and state law requires that you maintain a safe following distance while operating your truck.
- 10. Federal and state law requires you to obey traffic control devices, including road signs, you should never operate your truck in a manner that violates any traffic control devices.
- 11. Federal and state law requires you to operate your truck at a safe speed that is appropriate for the conditions in the environment you are driving.
- 12. You are required to comply with all DOT regulations and Swift Policies regarding Drug & Alcohol use.
- 13. Your CDL is the key to your livelihood. DOT regulations require you to immediately report anything that affects your CDL or physical condition. You are responsible for maintaining your license and qualifications and must immediately notify corporate Safety of changes to your status as a qualified CDL driver.
