WHAT WE DO

AIR FORCE BOMB SQUAD

Being a member of the Air Force's bomb squad requires you to handle live explosives on a routine basis as well as provide security and protection in a variety of environments.

- Identify, recover, disarm and dispose of unexploded ordnance
- Conduct nuclear weapons response and combat weapons of mass destruction
- Daily use of robotic systems, X-ray diagnostics and remote-controlled technology
- Analyze unknown munitions and explosives for intelligence agencies
- Provide protection to the President, Vice President and other dignitaries
- Assist with security at major international events such as the Olympics and world summits

WHAT IT TAKES

To become an EOD Airman you must meet these requirements:

- Minimum high school diploma, GED with 15 college credits or GED with an AFQT score of 50 or higher on the ASVAB
- Must be between the ages of 17 and 39
- Height must be no less than 62 inches and no more than 80 inches
- Normal depth perception and color vision
- No record of claustrophobia
- No record of emotional instability
- Minimum score of 30 on the EOD selection model
- Completion of Basic Military Training and Airmen's Week
