EDUCATION

From day one, you're automatically enrolled in the Community College of the Air Force. Your college credits add up quickly for Basic Military Training and technical school and can easily lead to an associate's degree in your career field from a regionally accredited institution.

To help you complete your degree, we'll pay up to 100 percent of your tuition and fees for classes taken on or off base through the Air Force Tuition Assistance Program.

And with the Post-9/11 GI Bill, you can receive up to 36 months of benefits for education and training opportunities outside of the Air Force. Generally, benefits are payable for 15 years following release from active duty and may be transferred to spouses or dependent children.

- 30 days of vacation with pay each year
- Live, work and travel around the world
- Comprehensive medical and dental care
